FOCUS ON YEAR 9/10 CAREERS PROGRAM

2016 will be the year of transition for the Careers Program at Moama Anglican Grammar. Year 10 students will continue with the existing program – attending weekly Careers lessons through terms 2 and 3, and participating in the Echuca Moama Beacon Foundation and other School career focused events. These include:

- Beacon Charter Signing and 15 Year Celebration (21 April)
- Careers Expo (28 April)
- Career Wise Testing (29 April) and follow-up Information Night for students and families where the CareerWise Report will be explained (11 May)
- Careers Camp to Melbourne (12-15 July)
- Beacon Mock Interviews (31 August)
- Work Experience (21-25 November)

Year 9 students will also participate in the Careers Program for the first time this year. The School has facilitated these changes to allow students to begin their career development earlier and progress through the program over a two year period. In addition to this, the Echuca Moama Beacon Foundation has also moved to become a Year 9 Program for our three local schools (Echuca College, St Joseph's College and Moama Anglican Grammar). The Beacon program complements our Careers Program so we are able to prepare for, and follow-up, Beacon events during Careers lessons. An example of this are the Beacon Mock Interviews held on 1 September. In the lead up to this, students will be learning about and preparing application letters, resumes and interview technique in our Careers lessons.

A perceived disadvantage to these changes is that students are forced to decide 'what they want to be' too early. Rest assured this will not happen, nor is it a goal of our Careers Program. The Year 9 program has one structured Careers lesson per fortnight, over the four terms, where students work through the following units:

- Personal Management understanding me and goal setting
- Learning and Work Exploration investigating jobs, understanding qualifications and raising aspirations
- Career Building applications, resumes and interview preparation
- Learning and Work Exploration cont. further job investigation and research
- Career Building cont. Career Action Plans

The Echuca Moama Beacon Foundation events include:

- 15th Anniversary Celebration Charter Signing 21 April
- Careers Expo 31 May
- Mock Interviews 1 September

Beacon Leaders will assist in running these, as well as being involved in additional events.

The Careers Program will continue through Year 10 in 2017. Students will not have structured Careers lessons, but will complete the CareerWise Testing (with an Information Night for students and families where the CareerWise Report will be explained), attend the Careers Camp in Melbourne, make subject selections for their HSC studies and participate in the Work Experience program. These activities will be supported through the Pastoral Care program.

The goal of our Careers Program is to provide opportunities for students to develop skills and knowledge which will enable them to plan and make informed decisions about their education, training and career choices. Students are encouraged to develop an understanding of who they are, and pursue their interests, while investigating careers

that match these with their skills. The reality is that many of the jobs current Year 9 and 10 students will go into have not been 'invented' yet. We should become less concerned with deciding 'what I want to be', and more concerned with finding out what I like doing, to then pursuing education and training in that area, while considering careers and looking for opportunities which need your particular skills and interests.

Fortnightly career newsletters will be emailed to students in Year 9-12 and their parents.

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VOCATIONAL AND HIGHER EDUCATION NEWS

Applying for Medicine/ Dentistry/ Oral Health/ Optometry?

If you are applying for any of these health science courses, you may need to sit the Undergraduate Medical Admissions Test (UMAT).

This is a three-part test that you sit in July 2016 and selected universities use your UMAT score as part of the selection process, in conjunction with your ATAR and in some cases an interview.

You will be tested on the following- logical reasoning and problem solving, understanding people and non verbal reasoning.

You will only have one chance to sit the UMAT this year- the test will be held Wednesday 27 July. You must be in Year 12 and you must register online to sit the test by 5pm 3 June.

It is important that you start to prepare for the test early. There are several private companies who offer commercial preparation programs – www.nie.edu.au/ and www.medentry.edu.au/ are examples.

It is important to note that the universities who use the UMAT do not endorse any of these companies and you will receive free preparation materials once you register for the test (registration is now open).
