The HSC

- Higher School Certificate (HSC) the highest educational award available in New South Wales Schools
- To achieve the HSC students must complete 12 units of Preliminary courses and 10 units of HSC courses
- Students must complete the Preliminary course first, before they are eligible to commence the corresponding HSC course
- Preliminary runs from Term 1 to Term 3 2018
- HSC Runs from Term 4 2018 Term 4 2019



The ATAR

- The ATAR is a rank, not a mark
- Best two units of English and your best 8 units from your subjects
- Strategy to get the best ATAR for you
- Choose what interests you!!

Your HSC marks

Your HSC marks provide information about how well you have achieved in each of the courses you have completed.

Your HSC Record of Achievement provides a profile of your performance in the different courses you have studied.

Your HSC marks are reported against standards.

Your HSC marks are provided by the Board.

Your ATAR

Your ATAR provides information about how well you have performed overall against other students.

Your ATAR allows you to be compared with students who have completed different combinations of courses.

Your ATAR is a rank, not a mark.

Your ATAR is provided by UAC.

Pathways in Year 11 and 12

We are in an era of <u>UBIQUITOUS</u> learning.

By 2030

- 2 billion of current jobs may be gone.
- Many jobs will have been non existent in 2017.
- Just under half of the number of current 5 year olds may need to be self employed to have a job.
- The amount of technical information is doubling every two years.







Pathways in Year 11 and 12



- ATAR and HSC heading towards further Tertiary Studies and careers that require a Degree.
- RoSA Record of School Achievement for those students aiming for an Apprenticeship, TAFE or the workforce. Modified Preliminary and HSC course.
- Traineeship that may involve the study of Work Studies and a workplace placement.
- Vocational Educational and Training (VET) subjects that gain students a certificate qualification.
- Completing HSC over two years.
- (Option of applying for a University course as a mature age student in later years).



Year 10 to Year 11 Pathways

Subjects offered at Year 9 and 10 Have pathways through the HSC, although they may not have the same names.

For Example – Forensic Science – is not a "HSC Subject" although its pathway leads to Legal Studies and Biology

Psychology – Leads to Society and Culture and Community and Family Studies




