The following students placed first in their respective events.

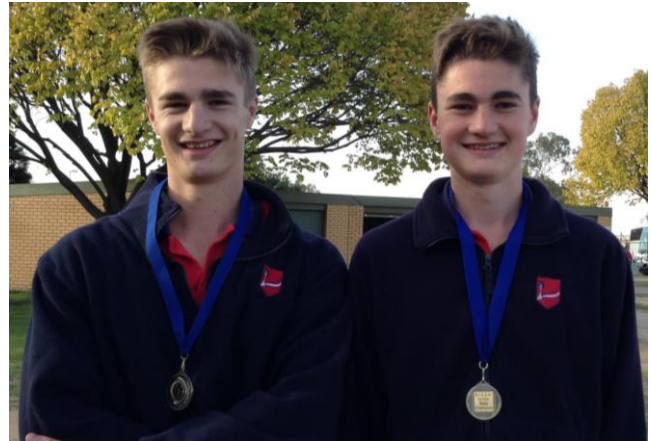
Benjamin Martin – Triple Jump
