Smoke-free Environment

In accordance with the EA recommends that the following policies be applied to all sporting and social events that we hold or we endorse * **No Smoking shall occur at or near sporting events involving children and young people under the age of 18. This policy shall apply to coaches, athletes, officials and volunteers** * **Social events shall be smoke-free, with smoking permitted at designated outdoor areas** * Coaches, officials, volunteers and athletes will refrain from smoking and remain smoke-free while they are involved in an official capacity in our sport.

Once you have entered, all requests for changes to entries must be made in writing and are at the discretion of the organization committee.

Horse Welfare

The welfare of the horse is paramount. Instances of cruelty or mistreatment should be reported to the organizing committee.

Unsoundness/ judges are required to satisfy themselves regarding soundness of all horses and therefore have the authority to stop and unsound horse during competition. At other times a horse that is stopped or reported by an official who considers it to be unsound must attend a soundness check by the organizing committee before continuing in the competition. Horse abuse we will not tolerate, and will result in elimination.

Important Etiquette

Please respect other riders and horses by not yelling, running, or interrupting when they are competing or in the stable or warm up areas. Spectators must enter the indoor arenas quietly or wait until the competitor is finished.

Number of Classes you may enter

You may enter all disciplines for \$160 per mount or enter individual section at listed prices.

Rider's entering classes MUST bear in mind that the welfare of the rider, horse and the relevant EA rules for the discipline. Riders are only allowed to enter 2 consecutive dressage levels on the same horse i.e. Prelim/Novice or Novice/Elem.

One horse, one rider. One rider with a maximum of 2 mounts may ride 2 horses in the same team.

Rider's show jumping may only enter one height class per horse.

Show horse riders must choose to compete in one section, Show Horse, Show Hunter or Working Hunter. Combined training riders may only compete in one class per combination per grading.

Same School Teams

Teams must represent the school they are attending. Teams will consist of a maximum of four riders.

Composite Teams

If your school is unable to field a team, you will be placed randomly in a composite team. Composite teams are made up of four riders from different schools.

University Teams

Consisting of 4 riders in a team who attend any University or TAFE on a full time basis.



University riders are not eligible for state qualifying events.

Team Manager

Each team requires an adult team manager, who is responsible for their riders and mounts during the competition, and completion of entries.

Uniforms

Team members are to wear the uniform of the school they currently attend. Uniform can consist of:

- School jumper, shirt, tie and light coloured jodhpurs.
- Polo shirt or Rugby shirt with school logos and jodhpurs.
- Riding boots are to be smooth soled and low heels boots (short or long refer discipline rules)
- Gloves are compulsory for the dressage.
- Gaiters and long boots may be worn in all disciplines except show horse, where top boots and gaiters can only be worn by competitors 18 years and over in rider phases.
- Mounts to have school coloured saddlecloths.
- Riders must provide their own bridle numbers, saddlecloth number or number holder.
- Riders must wear medical armbands when show jumping and riding games.

Helmets

All helmets must satisfy the Australian Safety Standards AS/NSZ 3838 or EN 1384 or ASTN F1163 and must be worn at all times whilst mounted.

Gear Check

There will be no gear checkpoints. Gear checks are the responsibility of the team manager. Discipline rules can be found on the EV or EA website. Judges have the right to eliminate a rider if they compete in incorrect gear immediately.

Lungeing

Lungeing can only take place in the round yard.

Competition Rules

- Only the competitor can ride his/her horse or pony on the day. The penalty of disobeying this rule is elimination.

Sections are divided into 3 years at each level for games and the activity course.

- Prep – Year 3
- Year 4, 5 & 6
- Year 7, 8 & 9
- Years 10, 11 & 12
- University level

Riders entering year prep– year 2 classes lead, must not have competed at any event off the lead.

Sections divided into Primary, Secondary and Senior for other disciplines

- Primary- Prep – Year 6
- Secondary Intermediate- Year 7, 8, & 9
- Senior- Year 10, 11, & 12

Riders Age**PRIMARY**

Primary competition is restricted to athletes up to 12 years of age, in the year of competition. Those athletes who may be over 12 years of age and still enrolled in primary school may apply to the committee for special consideration to be allowed to compete as a primary school student.

SECONDARY

Secondary competition is for those students who are 12 as of the 31st of January 2016, or turning 12 in the year of competition to those turning 18 in the year of competition. In dressage, secondary divisions are for those athletes turning 15, 16, 17 and 18 years of ages in the current year 2016.

INTERMEDIATE

Intermediate is defined as those athletes turning 12 (if in secondary school), 13 and 14 years of age in the current year 2016. Intermediate classes will only be run for dressage at novice level in accordance with national guidelines.

Scoring

- 1st = 11 points
- 2nd = 9 points
- 3rd = 7 points
- 4th = 5 points
- 5th = 3 point
- 6th = 1 point

If classes consist of less than 6 riders, first place will receive allocated points to the amount of riders, e.g. 4 horses = 7 points and so on.

Prizes

- Rosettes, Rugs and Prizes will be awarded to the winning same school teams, composite teams, and university teams.
- Rosettes will be awarded from 2nd – 6th for same school teams, composite teams, and university teams.
- All other events placing 1st- 6th
- Championship Rosettes for dressage section only.

Eligibility

Open to E.A, P.C.A.V, H.R.C.A.V and non-members who are currently enrolled at a primary, secondary, or university.

- Everybody must fill in the liability declaration form.
- \$10.00 day insurance fee is due **unless** you are a financial member of E.V/E.A, H.R.C.A.V or P.C.A.V.

Insurance

Refund Policy

Withdrawal of entries prior to the close of entries will have a refund of entry fees less a \$25 administration fee. Requests for refund of facility fees and stable costs need to be directed to Elmore Equestrian Club. No refunds after closing date except with a vet or medical certificate.

Dressage Rules

- All dressage test will be run in accordance current EA rules in the EA dressage competition rules, which can be obtained from www.equestrian.org.au/dressage-rules
- Whips are permitted (not exceeding 1.2m, including tassels for horses and 1.0m for ponies).
- Horses may not compete below their graded level (if an official dressage grading applies) however horses graded FEI are permitted to compete advanced.
- Only snaffle bits allowed unless competing at medium or above.
- Spurs can be used at all levels and ponies. As per current EA ruling.
- Tests can be called, except for PSG and Inter 1 as per EA rule.
- Dressage test can be downloaded at www.vic.equestrian.org.au
- Advanced, PSG and Inter 1 must obtain a score over 60% to gain points for your team. As per EA qualifying rule for PSG and Inter 1.
- Teams will gain points in each individual round.
- Championship rounds will be granted champion and runner-up, but no team point allocation.
- Open to P.C.A.V and H.R.C.A.V and E.A members only.
- Entries must include a photocopy of current grading card for each mount.
- You may ride a level higher than graded
- Friday schedule -Preparatory, Preliminary, Elementary,
- Saturday schedule -Novice, Medium, Advanced, PSG, Inter 1
- Allowing competitors to compete at 2 different levels for team points.
- Dressage is a qualifying event for state

Combined Training Rules

The Combined Training will run in accordance with EA Rules in the Current EA National Eventing Rulebook, which can be obtained from the website, and contains dressage and jumping phases only.

- Riders are only permitted to complete in one class per horse
- The same horse and rider combination must complete both phases of the competition. Elimination from one phase involves elimination from the competition.

Scoring System

- As combined training runs under Eventing rules, rider are placed based on the number of penalties they incur over the 2 phases. This means that the rider with the least penalties when penalties from the dressage and jumping phases are added will be the winner. Dressage penalties are calculated by subtracting the average percentage from 100 and multiplying it by 1.5. The result is always rounded to one decimal point. Jumping penalties are calculated in the normal manner as per jumping.
- In the case of equal scored for placing's in a class, the rider with the best dressage score (least penalties) will be the higher placed. If equality still exists, the closest to the optimum time (under the time set) in the jumping element will be the higher placed. If there is still a tie, the placing will be shared and the subsequent place not awarded.

Show jumping rounds are scored individually. There are no championships for this section

Phase 2- One Round Table A Article 238 2.1

Athletes with equality of penalties for any place are places in accordance with the time taken to complete the round. In the event of equality of penalties and time for first place, there may be a jump-off over a shortened course over obstacles, which may be increased in height/or spread in accordance with the provisions of the schedule. Please note- this is only if fault and times are exactly the same so it is very rare that this second round jump off is ever run.

Phase 3- Two Phase Article 274 5.3

This competition comprises two identical phases run without interruption, each at an identical or different speed, the finishing line for the first phase being identical with the starting line for the second phase.

The first phase is a course of 7 to 9 obstacles with or without combinations (Table A against the clock). The second phase takes place over 4 to 6 obstacles, which may include one combination (Table A against the clock).

Athletes penalized in the first phase are halted by ringing the bell after they have jumped the last obstacle or when the time allowed for the first phase has been exceeded, after crossing the finishing line of the first phase. They must stop after crossing the first finish line. Placing is according to the penalties and time in the second phase and, if necessary, the penalties and time in the first phase. Athletes stopped after the first phase may only be placed after athletes who have taken part in both phases. In the event of equality for first place, the ties athletes will be placed equal first

- Open to P.C.A.V and H.R.C.A.V and E.A members only.
- Entries must include a photocopy of current grading card for each mount.
- Show jumping is a qualifying event for state

Phase 2- Rider Class (judging the rider, not the smartest parade or turn out)

Phase 3- Ridden workout (judging the horse as a show hunter)

Working Hunter

Phase 1- In hand

Phase 2- Rider Class (judging the rider, not the smartest on parade)

Phase 3- Jumping and workout (judging the horse as a working hunter) 65cm for secondary and 45cm jumping for primary

Activity Course Rules

This discipline is designed to test a riders horsemanship skills and the willingness of the horse or pony. It is not a race. The focus is on how the rider completes the tasks. The judges will be looking for rhythm, calmness and straightness, similar to a dressage test with obstacles. This class is not judges on time however there is a time limit of 3 minutes, with no bonus points for finishing under this time. If you do go over the time limit you are regarded as finished and you will need to leave the arena. The points you have earned in this time will be your score. You may pick your own pace unless pace is specified for a specific task; however the judge will acknowledge the degree of difficulty required for faster paces. If you have a problem with your task, we recommend that you move on to the next task.

- This is a timed event
- Any Led mount in primary prep – year 3 will incur a 20 second time penalty

No martingales, whips or spurs may be used; use of the baton, reins or other article as a whip shall occur in elimination of the rider from the event. Bits must be plain snaffle with straight bar or a single joint in the middle. The mouthpiece must be smooth all round. Bitless bridles (including the hackamore) are NOT permitted.

This discipline is designed to test the horse and riders agility. It is judged on time. The class is designed to incorporate novelty games in the one event.

No martingales, whips or spurs may be used; use of the baton, reins or other article as a whip shall occur in elimination of the rider from the event. Bits must be plain snaffle with straight bar or a single joint in the middle. The mouthpiece must be smooth all round. Bitless bridles (including the hackamore) are NOT permitted.

Dress

No martingales, whips or spurs may be used; use of the baton, reins or other article as a whip shall occur in elimination of the rider from the event. Bits must be plain snaffle with straight bar or a single joint in the middle. The mouthpiece must be smooth all round. Bitless bridles (including the hackamore) are NOT permitted.
