Moama Anglican Grammar's next Open Afternoon on 15 June is a unique opportunity for 2019 Year 7's to participate in the second stage of our Transition Experience Program. The focus of this Open Afternoon is to showcase the Year 7&8 program and welcome students and families into our secondary school.

For many students transition from Primary to Secondary schools evokes a variety of emotions, including feelings of excitement, anxiousness and more than a few butterflies in the tummy! For families also, it is an exciting and challenging time.

We provide Year 7 2019 students with opportunities to develop social relationships within their year level, extend their knowledge about what it will be like to be a Moama Anglican Grammar secondary student and to build their personal confidence.

The Open Afternoon Showcase Year 7&8, will involve our current Year 6 students and new students offered places for 2019. The afternoon will consist of a brief introductory session by the Principal and Heads of School who explain the culture, ethos, structure and operations of the school. This will be followed by a rotation through activities for all students for Year 7 2019 and their parents.

The activities consist of a tour of the school by our school ambassadors. We encourage you to ask as many questions as you like of our ambassadors to hear their unique perspectives on being a student at Moama Anglican Grammar.

The other activities are "mini" lessons for Year 7 2019 students to participate in. We believe strongly that we have the best educational program and most expert teachers in the area.
