STEP 4: INTERVIEW

Shortlisted based on UCAT and ATAR results.

If you don't receive an invite for an interview, you won't be eligible for a place in the MD. Invitations will be emailed late December and interviews will be held during January 2022.

COURSE (UNDERGRADUATE TO GRADUATE ENTRY)

La Trobe University and The University of Melbourne have a joint medical program for applicants with a regional / rural background.

Short-listed applicants offered a Multi Mini Interview will be sent an email in late December or early January detailing the interview process and are required to attend the interview in January.

STEP 4: OFFERS

Offers will be released via VTAC or UAC in January and will be based on selection rank (ATAR with SEAS adjustment) (30%) and interview performance (70%).

YEAR 12 STUDENTS - VTAC

To be eligible for the MD, Year 12 students must apply for one of the eligible courses at Monash via VTAC.

STEP 1: UNDERGRADUATE DEGREE

Complete one of the following Monash University undergraduate bachelor degrees:

Biomedicine (includes combined degrees)

Science (includes combined degrees)

Pharmacy (Honours)

Physiotherapy (Honours)

Note – there are 73 places in the MD. At least 70% of places are reserved for Biomedical Science graduates.

STEP 2: APPLY FOR COURSE


Apply for the course direct to Monash. Apply for the Dean's Rural List and/or Rural End to End Program later if eligible and invited to do so.

STEP 3: INTERVIEW + TEST

Graduates who have achieved the required Weighted Average Mark in the undergraduate degree may be invited to sit the Multiple Mini Interview (MMI) and the Situational Judgement Test (JST).

STEP 4: OFFERS

Offers are based on the ranking of the applicant's undergraduate academic performance (40%) and MMI / SJT (60%) after final results have been released. Within the 78 places, there are rural and bonded places that applicants can apply for.

Complete a bachelor degree from any university. Note – guaranteed entry may be available into the MD – information is on the next page.

STEP 2: GAMSAT

Complete the Graduate Medical School Admissions Test (GAMSAT)

STEP 3: APPLY FOR COURSE


Apply for course via Graduate Entry Medical School Admission System (GEMSAS).


STEP 3: INTERVIEW

Short listed applicants will complete the Multi-Mini Interview (MMI).

STEP 4: OFFERS

Offers will be made on the basis of a combined ranked list where the interview will contribute 50%, GPA will contribute 25% and GAMSAT will contribute 25% to the final ranking after interview.

Students who achieve a high ATAR (general entry 99.9+, Indigenous entry – 90+) and study a University of Melbourne Bachelor degree immediately after Year 12 will be eligible for a place in the Melbourne Chancellor's Scholarship.

Chancellor's Scholars will be guaranteed a Commonwealth Supported Place in the Doctor of Medicine providing they meet the following entry requirements:

- Successfully complete the Multi Mini Interview.
- Pass all prerequisite subjects on the first attempt in the undergraduate degree.
