Dear School families

I take this opportunity at this time of year to provide our information regarding fees for 2022, along with an update on key facility developments across the School.

You will be aware that in 2020 the Board made the decision not to increase the fees for 2021, owing to the uncertainty and impacts of COVID-19 faced by the community. This year, after careful consideration of the economic impact of COVID-19 on our school community, along with balancing the need to accommodate annual salary increases and increasing operational costs, the Board has made the decision that fees will increase for 2022, as outlined on page 5 of this booklet. It is also essential that the School continues to maintain a high standard of buildings and infrastructure, and as such the Capital and Maintenance Levy has increased for 2022.

Our payment and direct debit options will continue as usual, to provide flexible options for families. The School has also made provision in the budget to provide assistance to those families who are financially impacted by COVID-19, and I encourage these families to make contact with our School Business Manager, Mrs Suzanna Barry if assistance is needed.

This year we have continued to develop and maintain the school grounds, with the refurbishment of several class rooms, new paths and gardens. Early in 2022 we will be installing 2 music pods, and also hope to progress an outdoor garden chapel. We have also installed a fibre to premises internet service which was very timely and helpful, given the recent off-site learning and teaching.

In addition to these projects we are continuing to focus on improving our general facilities and our ICT infrastructure and network security, to enrich the learning opportunities of our students.



Our Strategic Plan

The Strategic Plan is one of the School's key guiding documents, and provides a framework for the Board and management. The Plan was developed in 2019, and implementation commenced in 2020.

We will position Moama Anglican Grammar for the future by:

- reviewing our masterplan to ensure that infrastructure is of a high standard and facilities are scalable in line with regional population and enrolment patterns.
- ensuring that our planning for the future is in line with the predicted demographic changes of the Echuca Moama region.
- positioning Moama Anglican Grammar to be the school of choice within this area.

We will prepare students for the future by:

- using research to further develop our staff's skills to ensure continuous growth and development. We will support and promote career pathways for all staff.
- further developing staff skills and professionalism with a holistic approach to development to improve student academic outcomes and promote teaching and learning excellence.
- further developing processes to proactively attract and retain high quality staff, giving our students a greater opportunity to succeed.
- ensuring our students have access to the best learning tools, platforms and high impact strategies.

Building and facility developments

Our Property Services/Maintenance team have been busy with a number of projects with the refurbishment of our Middle School classrooms and the Food Technology theory room, including the replacement of air conditioners. A concrete path has been completed outside the Primary School and a new garden project in front of the hall is also underway. An upgrade of the Middle School toilets (which includes the installation of individual change cubicles) is also due to commence later this year.

Our maintenance team continue to work hard to maintain our buildings and ground to a high standard. Underground drainage works were undertaken in the Primary car park and also within the school. In Term 3 this year a sprinkler system in the grounds near the uniform shop was installed. During the term break the under cover area will be resurfaced.



Portable Music Pods

Two Hawyn Music Practice Pods have been ordered for installation early March 2022. This investment supports our ever expanding music program. The Pods will be located in the space adjacent to the secondary music room and opposite the Stephanie Alexander Garden, creating a modern music village that will liven up the area.



Outdoor Garden Chapel

Planning is currently in progress for an Outdoor Garden Chapel. This space will be a multi-use space for School Chapel Services, School band performances, a student lunch time reflection area and outdoor classes. It is anticipated that future uses could also include special occasions such as weddings.




Tuition Fee Structure 2022

Moama Anglican Grammar aims to set fees at a level that provides access to quality education in a safe and inspiring environment to as many families as possible.

To achieve this, we balance affordable education with the cost of providing quality facilities, staff and resources.

The 2022 fee schedule considers salaries, education costs, business costs (e.g. insurance), IT, facilities and maintenance costs for existing building and equipment across the whole of the School.

Note: Year 11 and 12 fees are calculated based on 7 terms over 2 years. Weekly – term breakdown of fees are approximate calculations.

Sibling discounts

The School provides a reduction in tuition fees if parents have more than one child enrolled at Moama Anglican Grammar in the same year. Sibling discounts are allocated to each student based on the below figures.

Siblings attending (Kinder-Year 12)	Discount
1 st child	-

3 rd child	25%
4 th child	30%

This discount is for Tuition Fees only.

Alumni Levy

An Alumni charge of \$100 will be levied with the Term 2 fees for each Year 7 student or for each new student entering the Secondary School. This non-refundable charge represents a once only contribution to the School's Alumni Program.

Included in the Tuition Fees 2022

The Annual Tuition Fee provides for a full range of academic services available at the school. The fee includes expenses associated with compulsory activities such as annual year level camps, local excursions and incursions, student accident insurance, class-based music and singing lessons (and instrument provision), debating and public speaking competitions. Information technology costs such as internet access, a printing allowance and technology resources are also included. Students in K-2 access class sets of iPads, and Chrome Books for Years 3-6. Currently an iPad is provided for Years 7-9, however students are encouraged to bring their own device from Year 7. Please note that if a camp is cancelled due to external factors, and not replaced with an alternate activity, a credit will be applied to school fees.

Early Payment Discounts

An early payment discount of 3% (2% for credit card - master/visa) applies to full year fees paid by 31 October the year prior to enrolment.

Any outstanding balance must be paid for the discount to apply. The discount is only applicable for families paying standard tuition fees.

Fee Payment Methods and Due dates

School fee accounts are emailed to parents each term. Fees are charged quarterly in advance and may be paid weekly, fortnightly, monthly or annually (see table above for breakdown).

School fee payment methods:

- Direct debit via credit card
- Direct debit via bank account
- EFTPOS
- Cash or Cheque

Dishonour payment fees are billed to the family.

Capital levy charges

The Capital and Maintenance Levy is a compulsory annual charge of \$550 per student. It is used to fund the school's building and maintenance program. Donations to the Building Fund in excess of this levy are tax deductible.

Additional Charges

Specialised excursions, private music tuition, text books, online learning platforms are charged on a cost recovery basis.

An additional charge for the supply of e-text and online learning provisions will be sent with Term 2 fees for Year 5-12 students.

Subject specific camps such as Service trips, PASS (Physical Activity and Sports Studies) etc are also additional charges if your child chooses to participate in these activities.

VET subjects will each have subject specific fees associated with them according to specific training needs.

Building Fund

All families are encouraged to make a voluntary contribution to the Building Fund to assist the School with essential building maintenance and future building development.

Scholarships

The School has a Scholarship Fund to facilitate enrolment at Moama Anglican Grammar. Scholarship opportunities are offered to Students from Year 5-11 and include Academic, General Excellence and Performing Arts. A scholarship can be a life-changing gift, offering students the opportunity of a safe and inspiring education. Scholarship applications generally begin in Term 1.

These contributions are both tax deductible.

Overdue Accounts and Reminders

Reminder notices will be issued by email to all families who have not settled the tuition fee account by the due date.

A student may be prevented from commencing a new term whilst fees from the previous term remain unpaid at the discretion of the School. Extra activities/excursions are not available to students whose fees are in arrears.

Split Families

In relation to the collection of School Fees, Moama Anglican Grammar is under the rules and obligations of Contract Law therefore it should be noted that Child Support Agreements and Family Law Court Orders are agreements between parents/carers and do not impose obligations on schools in relation to invoicing nor do they negate Joint and Several Liability.

Notice of Withdrawal of a Student

The School asks parents to understand that commitments to teachers, salaries and other expenses are planned and made in advance, on the basis of educating a student for a full year. One full term notice in writing is required in the case of a student choosing to withdraw from the School. If less than a term notice is given, a full term fees per student will be charged unless exceptional circumstances apply. For the avoidance of doubt, a full term notice is considered to be notice given before the first day of a term about the following term (e.g. a student will not attend from Term 3; notice is given of withdrawal before the first day of term 2, unless there are extenuating circumstances that the School may consider).

Questions and Queries

The School recognises that circumstances may arise which requires families to seek changes to how fees are to be paid. Such changes are to be discussed and arranged with the Business Manager, and families are encouraged to communicate early and often, through such periods. In the first instance, please contact our Accounts Officer as soon as possible so we can assist. If parents have genuine difficulties in paying fees, due to changed circumstances, we encourage them to discuss the matter confidentiality with the Business Manager.

Application and Admission Fees

An Application Fee of \$100 for the first child, \$85 for the second child and \$75 for the third and subsequent children is payable at the time of lodging an application form. Upon acceptance of a place offered for 2021, a \$200 non-refundable Enrolment Acceptance Fee is payable, along with one term's Tuition Fees and Capital Levy.

2022 Enrolments: An Enrolment Fee of \$1,000 is payable by the date nominated in the formal letter of offer and will confirm acceptance of a place. Of this fee \$200 is a non-refundable Enrolment Acceptance Fee. The remaining \$800 is credited against the Term 2 Tuition Fee in the student's first year of attendance.

No student may commence until all initial charges (Application Fee, Enrolment Fee and one term's Tuition Fee) have been paid, and there are no overdue fees or charges for siblings.
