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<p>Code of Conduct for Contractors, Volunteers and Visitors</p>	<p>Moama Anglican Grammar values the contribution of all members of the school community in volunteering their time and effort.</p> <p>To assist the school in providing a safe environment and a positive educational climate, you are expected to comply with the following:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Observe safe work practices;• Report any safety hazard;• Follow reasonable safety instructions given by supervisors;• Treat everyone with courtesy, consideration and humility;• Take reasonable instruction from staff;• Not obstruct staff in the execution of their duties;• Use non-discriminatory respectful and non-judgmental language;• Maintain appropriate levels of confidentiality;• Seek advice where appropriate;• Not utilise your position to take advantage of any young person.
